abraham flexner 1866 1959 raised in louisville kentucky in a family of poor jewish immigrants from germany attended the johns hopkins university in the first decade of its existence after graduating in 1886 he founded four years before john dewey s chicago laboratory school a progressive experimental school in louisville that won the attention of harvard president charles w eliot after a successful nineteen years as teacher and principal he turned his attention to medical education on behalf of the carnegie foundation his 1910 survey known as the flexner report stimulated much needed radical changes in american medical schools with its emphasis on full time clinical teaching it remains the most widely cited document on how doctors best learn their profession flexner s subsequent projects a book on medical education in europe and a comparative study of medical education in europe and america remain unsurpassed in range and insight for fifteen years a senior officer in the rockefeller supported general education board in new york city he helped distribute grants more than 6 billion in today s dollars for education in medicine and other subjects and started the lincoln school in 1917 his devastating critique of american higher education intellectual inquiry not job training is the purpose of the university raised important questions upsetting many educators in 1930 flexner created and led the institute for advanced study at princeton convincing albert einstein to accept the first appointment at the new institute iconoclast is a thoughtful wonderfully crafted solidly researched account of an uncommon life that far exceeds abraham flexner s association with reform in medical education bonner's labors have produced a critical insightful portrait of flexner as a brilliant tireless extraordinarily persuasive visionary in addition to detailed portraits of the man at the vortex of swiftly moving scientific educational and philanthropic currents in higher education in the united states bonner also provides an account of flexner s personal life iconoclast offers a learned portrait of the distance traveled in medical education during the past 100 years in this biography of brilliant chinese scholar wang kuo wei bonner throws light on the range and course of ideas in early 20th century china she critically examines wang s essays on german philosophy and aesthetics his poetry literary criticism and aesthetic theory and his works on ancient chinese history particularly of the shang dynasty

focusing on the social intellectual and political context in which medical education took place thomas neville bonner offers a detailed analysis of transformations in medical instruction in the united kingdom france germany and the united states between the enlightenment and world war ii from a unique comparative perspective this study considers how divergent approaches to medical instruction in these countries mirrored as well as impacted their particular cultural contexts the book opens with an examination of key developments in medical education during the late eighteenth century and continues by tracing the evolution of clinical teaching practices in the early 1800s it then charts the rise of laboratory based teaching in the nineteenth century and the progression toward the establishment of university standards for medical education during the early twentieth century throughout the author identifies changes in medical student populations and student life including the opportunities available for women and minorities

duden asserts that the most basic biological and medical terms that we use to describe our own bodies male and female healthy or sick are cultural constructions to illustrate this she delves into records of an 18th century german physician who documented the medical histories of 1 800 women of all ages and backgrounds often in their own words

first published in 1996 following the author's previous work women in science antiquity through the nineteenth century in 1986 an increased interest in feminism science and gender issues resulted in this subsequent title this book will be valuable to scholars working in a variety of academic areas and will be useful at different educational levels from secondary through graduate school this annotated bibliography of approximately 2700 entries also includes fields nationality periods persons institutions reference and theme indexes

on a spring morning in 1914 in the stark foothills of southern colorado members of the united mine workers of america clashed with guards employed by the rockefeller family and a state militia beholden to colorado s industrial barons when the dust settled nineteen men women and children among the miners families lay dead the strikers had killed at least thirty men destroyed six mines and laid waste to two company towns killing for coal offers a bold and original perspective on the 1914 ludlow massacre and the great coalfield war in a sweeping story of transformation that begins in the coal beds and culminates with the deadliest strike in american history thomas andrews illuminates the causes and consequences of the militancy that erupted in colliers strikes over the course of nearly half a century he reveals a complex world shaped by the connected forces of land labor corporate industrialization and workers resistance brilliantly conceived and written this book takes the organic world as its starting point the resulting elucidation of the coalfield wars goes far beyond traditional labor history considering issues of social and environmental justice in the context of an economy dependent on fossil fuel andrews makes a powerful case for rethinking the relationships that unite and divide workers consumers capitalists and the natural world

the authors argue that the rules and practices of corporate law mimic contractual provisions that parties would reach if they bargained about every contingency at zero cost and flawlessly enforced their agreements but bargaining and enforcement are costly and corporate law provides the rules and an enforcement mechanism that govern relations among those who commit their capital to such ventures the authors work out the reasons for supposing that this is the exclusive function of corporate law and the implications of this perspective

sarah hrdy argues that if human babies were to survive in a world of scarce resources they would need to be cared for not only by their mothers but also by siblings aunts fathers friends and with any luck grandmothers out of this complicated and contingent form of childrearing says hrdy came the human capacity for understanding others

he faced the dilemmas of maintaining the cohesion of the alliance especially with the french withdrawal from nato while trying to reduce tensions between eastern and western europe managing bitter conflicts over international monetary and trade policies and prosecuting an escalating war in southeast asia book jacket

david bordwell s new book is at once a history of film criticism an analysis of how critics interpret film and a proposal for an alternative program for film studies it is an anatomy of film criticism meant to reset the agenda for film scholarship as such making meaning should be a landmark book a focus for debate from which future film study will evolve bordwell systematically maps different strategies for interpreting films and making meaning illustrating his points with a vast array of examples from western film criticism following an introductory chapter that sets out the terms and scope of the argument bordwell goes on to show how critical institutions constrain and contain the very practices they promote and how the interpretation of texts has become a central preoccupation of the humanities he gives lucid accounts of the development of film criticism in france britain and the united states since world war ii analyzes this development through two important types of criticism thematic explicatory and symptomatic and shows that both types usually seen as antithetical in fact have much in common these diverse and even warring schools of criticism share conventional rhetorical and problem solving techniques a point that has broad ranging

implications for the way critics practice their art the book concludes with a survey of the alternatives to criticism based on interpretation and finally with the proposal that a historical poetics of cinema offers the most fruitful framework for film analysis

in 1895 there was not a single case of dementia praecox reported in the united states by 1912 there were tens of thousands of people with this diagnosis locked up in asylums hospitals and jails by 1927 it was fading away how could such a terrible disease be discovered affect so many lives and then turn out to be something else in vivid detail richard noll describes how the discovery of this mysterious disorder gave hope to the overworked asylum doctors that they could at last explain though they could not cure the miserable patients surrounding them the story of dementia praecox and its eventual replacement by the new concept of schizophrenia also reveals how asylum physicians fought for their own respectability if what they were observing was a disease then this biological reality was amenable to scientific research in the early twentieth century dementia praecox was psychiatry s key into an increasingly science focused medical profession but for the moment nothing could be done to help the sufferers when the concept of schizophrenia offered a fresh understanding of this disorder and hope for a cure psychiatry abandoned the old disease for the new in this dramatic story of a vanished diagnosis noll shows the co dependency between a disease and the scientific status of the profession that treats it the ghost of dementia praecox haunts today s debates about the latest generation of psychiatric disorders

if harvard can be said to have a literature all its own then few universities can equal it in scope here lies the reason for this anthology a collection of what harvard men teachers students graduates have written about harvard in the more than three centuries of its history the emphasis is upon entertainment upon readability and the selections have been arranged to show something of the many variations of harvard life for all harvard men and that part of the general public which is interested in american college life here is a rich treasury in such a harvard collection one may expect to find the giants of harvard s last 75 years eliot lowell and conant attempting a definition of what harvard means but there are many other familiar names henry dunster oliver wendell holmes james russell lowell henry adams charles m flandrau william and henry james owen wister thomas wolfe john p marquaud here is mistress eaton s confession about the bad fish served to the wretched students of harvard s early years here too is president holyoke s account of the burning of harvard hall a student's description of his trip to portsmouth with that aged and johnsonian character tutor henry flynt cleveland amory s retelling of the murder of dr george parkman mayor quiney s story of what happened in cambridge when andrew jackson came to get an honorary degree alistair cooke s commentary on the great harvard yale cricket match of 1951 there are many sorts of harvard men in this book popular fellows like hammersmith snobs like bertie and billy the sensitive and the lonely like edwin arlington robinson and thomas wolfe and independent thinkers like john reed teachers and pupils scholars and sports heroes and roques pass across the harvard stage through the struggles and the tragedies to the moments of triumph like the bicentennial or the visit of winston churchill and speaking of visits there are the visitors too the first impressions of harvard set down by an assortment of travelers as various as dickens trollope rupert brooke harriet martineau and francisco de miranda the precursor of latin american independence for the harvard addict this volume is indispensable for the general reader it is the sort of book that goes with a good living room fire or the blissful moments of early to bed

legend has it that twenty miles of volcanic rock rising through the landscape of northern bohemia was the work of the devil who separated the warring czechs and germans by building a wall the nineteenth century invention of the devil s wall was evidence of rising ethnic tensions in interwar czechoslovakia sudeten german nationalists conceived a radical mission to try to restore german influence across the region mark cornwall tells the story of heinz rutha an internationally recognized figure in his day who was the pioneer of a youth movement that emphasized male bonding in its quest to reassert german dominance over czech space through a narrative that unravels the threads of rutha s own repressed sexuality cornwall shows how czech authorities misinterpreted rutha s mission as sexual deviance and in 1937 charged him with corrupting adolescents the resulting scandal led to rutha s imprisonment suicide and excommunication from the nationalist cause he had devoted his life to furthering cornwall is the first historian to tackle the long taboo subject of how youth homosexuality and nationalism intersected in a fascist environment the devil s wall also challenges the notion that all sudeten german nationalists were nazis and supplies a fresh explanation for britain s appeasement of hitler showing why the british might justifiably have supported the 1930s sudeten german cause in this readable biography of an ardent german bohemian who participated as perpetrator witness and victim cornwall radically reassesses the czech german struggle of early twentieth century europe

in this excursion into medical and psychoanalytic history paul e stepansky charts the rise and fall of the surgical metaphor freud s view of psychoanalysis as analogous to a surgical procedure approaching freud s understanding of surgery and surgeons historically and biographically stepansky draws the reader into the world of late nineteenth century heroic surgery a world into which sigmund freud himself was drawn from publisher s description

We cannot simultaneously know the exact values of the x and y components of its orbital angular momentum; only one component (often chosen to be J_z) and the total magnitude are precisely defined. The same applies to the electron's intrinsic angular momentum (spin), which is also quantized and described by similar operators and quantum numbers. Another example lies in the Stern-Gerlach experiment, which demonstrates the quantization of angular momentum. By passing a beam of silver atoms through an inhomogeneous magnetic field, the experiment reveals the quantization of the z-component of the atomic magnetic moment, directly linked to the electron's spin angular momentum. The non-commuting nature of the angular momentum components is crucial to understanding the splitting of the beam observed in the experiment.

5. Conclusion

The commutation relations of angular momentum operators are a cornerstone of quantum mechanics. They reveal the inherent uncertainty in simultaneously measuring different components of angular momentum, a direct consequence of the Heisenberg uncertainty principle. Understanding these relations is essential for interpreting the behaviour of quantum systems, from atomic orbitals to the spin of elementary particles. The quantization of angular momentum, as evidenced by quantum numbers and exemplified in experiments like the Stern-Gerlach experiment, confirms the validity of this fundamental aspect of quantum theory.
