egypt s sun queen magnificently revealed in a new book by renowned egyptologist aidan dodson during the last half of the fourteenth century bc egypt was perhaps at the height of its prosperity it was against this background that the amarna revolution occurred throughout its instigator king akhenaten had at his side his great wife nefertiti when a painted bust of the queen found at amarna in 1912 was first revealed to the public in the 1920s it soon became one of the great artistic icons of the world nefertiti s name and face are perhaps the best known of any royal woman of ancient egypt and one of the best recognized figures of antiquity but her image has come in many ways to overshadow the woman herself nefertiti s current world dominion as a cultural and artistic icon presents an interesting contrast with the way in which she was actively written out of history soon after her own death this book explores what we can reconstruct of the life of the gueen tracing the way in which she and her image emerged in the wake of the first tentative decipherment of egyptian hieroglyphs during the 1820s 1840s and then took on the world over the next century and beyond all indications are that her final fate was a tragic one but although every effort was made to wipe out nefertiti s memory after her death modern archaeology has rescued the queen pharaoh from obscurity and set her on the road to today s international status

egypt history eighteenth dynasty ca 1570 1320 b c

more than three thousand years ago a sculptor working in the royal city of amarna carved a limestone bust of an egyptian queen the queen was nefertiti consort of the heretic pharaoh akhenaten plastered and painted nefertiti s bust depicted an extraordinarily beautiful woman however akhenaten s reign was drawing to an end and the royal family was soon to be written out of egypt s official history not long after its creation the stone nefertiti was locked in a storeroom and forgotten in 1912 the bust was re discovered and transported to germany initially hidden from the public view the beautiful queen was eventually displayed in berlin museum instantly she became an ancient world celebrity egypt has yielded more than its fair share of artistic masterpieces but no other sculpture has so successfully bridged the gap between the ancient and modern worlds the timeless beauty of the nefertiti bust both attracts us and sparks our imagination but in so doing it obscures our view of the past shifting attention not only from the other members of the amarna court but also from other equally valid representations of nefertiti herself in this book joyce tyldesley explores the creation of a cultural icon from its ancient origins to its modern context its discovery its display and its dual role as a political pawn and artistic inspiration

nefertiti s sun temple publishes stone relief fragments excavated from the site of kom el nana at tell el amarna egypt dating to approximately 1350 bce this is the first time relief fragments can be associated with a specific wall from a specific temple at tell el amarna jacquelyn williamson reconstructs the architecture art and inscriptions from the site to demonstrate kom el nana is the location of queen nefertiti s sunshade of re temple and another more enigmatic structure that served the funerary needs of the non royal courtiers at the ancient city the art

and inscriptions provide new information about queen nefertiti and challenge assumptions about her role in pharaoh akhenaten s religious movement dedicated to the sun god aten

nefertiti 1370 bc 1330 bc the great queen is best known to us for her striking beauty her famous bust brought her to life and ever since its discovery in 1912 by german archeologist ludwig borchardt her image has been the face of egypt most people know her solely based on the bust but she is much more than just a pretty face nefertiti was a major player in a time of great upheaval in egyptian history she was on the forefront of a religious revolution that she and her husband akhenaten began she was by his side from day one and was a devoted servant to this new religion that rocked egypt to its core not much is known about the woman herself or her inner thoughts so we will need to talk about her in a larger context we will attempt to cover ever so briefly the life of this great queen nefertiti the great queen of amarna about the interviews with history series the goal of the interviews with history series is to provide concise biographical information for people who want to read biographies but do not have the time to read hundreds of pages or purchase expensive study courses what you read in an interviews with history titles are the pertinent facts no filler written in an easy to understand and conversational fashion

tell el amarna is the modern name for the ancient egyptian city of akhenaten situated in a bay of hills formed by the cliffs of the eastern desert about halfway between cairo and luxor the city was founded in the 14th century bc by the pharaoh akhenaten to be a royal palace for himself and his wife nefertiti the capital of all egypt and the center of the state cult of the sun god in the form of aten sun disc which became an obsession of the pharoah the city contained temples palaces state buildings and great private mansions but was abandoned by akhenaten s successor his son tutenkhamen and the city was demolished never to be re inhabited this volume presents a detailed illustrated catalog of the many statues statuettes reliefs inlays and inscriptions recorded and collected by flinders petrie together with glass and faience objects and moulds part ii provides a summary of developments in royal names and titles with a discussion on research into names and evidence of royal status

the first of its kind exhibit cataloged here focuses on the women of egypt from all levels of society in works compiled strictly from american collections by american curators because the quantity of written records is limited though enormous in comparison to most early societies there is still much guesswork involved in determining the place women held in egyptian society it is clear that unlike most ancient and not so ancient societies egypt conferred on women the legal right to own property and to barter their own goods which means a larger record for current study the essays here are both erudite and fascinating to read the illustrations are clear and well presented in conjunction with the text 117 colour 112 b w illustrations

little is known about nefertiti the egyptian queen whose name means a beautiful woman has come she was the wife of akhenaten the pharaoh who ushered in the dramatic amarna age and she bore him at least six children she played a prominent role in political and religious affairs but after akhenaten s death she apparently vanished and was soon forgotten yet nefertiti remains one of the most famous and enigmatic women who ever lived her instantly recognizable face adorns a variety of modern artifacts from expensive jewelry to cheap postcards t shirts and bags all over the world she has appeared on page stage screen and opera in britain one woman has spent hundreds of thousands of pounds on plastic surgery in hope of resembling the long dead royal this enduring obsession is the result of just one object the lovely and mysterious nefertiti bust created by the sculptor thutmose and housed in berlin s neues museum since before world war ii in nefertiti s face egyptologist joyce tyldesley tells the story of the bust from its origins in a busy workshop of the late bronze age to its rediscovery and controversial removal to europe in 1912 and its present status as one of the world s most treasured artifacts this wide ranging history takes us from the temples and tombs of ancient egypt to wartime berlin and engages the latest in pharaonic scholarship tyldesley sheds light on both nefertiti s life and her improbable afterlife in which she became famous simply for being famous

an ancient inscription identified some of the ruins at el amarna as the place of the letters of the pharaoh discovered there circa 1887 were nearly four hundred cuneiform tablets containing correspondence of the egyptian court with rulers of neighboring states in the mid fourteenth century b c previous translations of these letters were both incomplete and reflected an imperfect understanding of the babylonian dialects in which they were written william moran devoted a lifetime of study to the amarna letters to prepare this authoritative english translation the letters provide a vivid record of high level diplomatic exchanges that by modern standards are often less than diplomatic an assyrian ruler complains that the egyptian king s latest gift of gold was not even sufficient to pay the cost of the messengers who brought it the king of babylon refuses to give his daughter in marriage to the pharaoh without first having proof that the king s sister already one of the pharaoh s many wives is still alive and well the king of karaduniyash complains that the egyptian court has detained his messenger for the past six years and egyptian vassal rib hadda writing from the besieged port of byblos repeatedly demands military assistance for his city or failing that an egyptian ship to permit his own escape

a book riot 100 must read book on ancient history death burial and the afterlife were as important to the ancient egyptians as how they lived this well illustrated book explores all aspects of death in ancient egypt including beliefs of the afterlife mummification the protection of the body tombs and their construction and decoration funerary goods and the funeral itself it also addresses the relationship between the living and the dead and the magico religious interaction of these two in ancient egyptian culture salima ikram s own experience with experimental mummification and funerary archaeology lends the book many completely original and provocative insights in addition a full survey of current development in the field

makes this a unique book that combines all aspects of death and burial in ancient egypt into one volume

akhenaten also known as amenhotep iv was king of egypt during the eighteenth dynasty and reigned from 1375 to 1358 b c e called the religious revolutionary he is the earliest known creator of a new religion the cult he founded broke with egypt s traditional polytheism and focused its worship on a single deity the sun god aten erik hornung one of the world s preeminent egyptologists here offers a concise and accessible account of akhenaten and his religion of light hornung begins with a discussion of the nineteenth century scholars who laid the foundation for our knowledge of akhenaten s period and extends to the most recent archaeological finds he emphasizes that akhenaten s monotheistic theology represented the first attempt in history to explain the entire natural and human world on the basis of a single principle akhenaten made light the absolute reference point hornung writes and it is astonishing how clearly and consistently he pursued this concept hornung also addresses such topics as the origins of the new religion pro found changes in beliefs regarding the afterlife and the new egyptian capital at akhetaten which was devoted to the service of aten his prophet akhenaten and the latter s family

william j murnane 1945 2000 dedicated his life to the epigraphic recording and historical interpretation of the monuments of pharaonic egypt in tribute to his important contributions to egyptology a prominent group of his colleagues and students offer a range of new studies on egyptian epigraphy and historiography amarna studies loom large in the volume as they did in murnane s own work several chapters investigate the art history and chronology of the reigns of akhenaten and his immediate successors other contributions deal with historical issues especially those connected with the epigraphic and archaeological aspects of the theban temples of karnak and luxor the book is richly illustrated with photographs and drawings
