this book directly explores congressional efforts to control the ability of the chief executive to use force it examines the influence congress has wielded over nuclear arms control and reveals how congress has operated to channel american military assistance covert actions and open warfare over the past forty years

interviews and previously classified documents of how america s presidents and generals have thought about threatened broached and just barely avoided nuclear war from the dawn of the atomic age until today kaplan s historical research and deep reporting will stand as the permanent record of politics discussing theories that have dominated nightmare scenarios from hiroshima and nagasaki kaplan presents the unthinkable in terms of mass destruction and demonstrates how the nuclear war reality will not go away regardless of the dire consequences

the book examines the public s influence on foreign policy through case studies including the formosa straits crisis intervention at dien bien phu the sputnik launch the new look defense strategy the panama canal treaties the soviet invasion of afghanistan the strategic defense initiative the beirut marine barracks bombing german reunification the gulf war and intervention in somalia and bosnia

in the revolution has come robyn c spencer traces the black panther party s organizational evolution in oakland california where hundreds of young people came to political awareness and journeyed to adulthood as members challenging the belief that the panthers were a projection of the leadership spencer draws on interviews with rank and file members fbi files and archival materials to examine the impact the organization s internal politics and cointelpro s political repression had on its evolution and dissolution she shows how the panthers members interpreted implemented and influenced party ideology and programs initiated dialogues about gender politics highlighted ambiguities in the panthers armed stance and criticized organizational priorities spencer also centers gender politics and the experiences of women and their contributions to the panthers and the black power movement as a whole providing a panoramic view of the party s organization over its sixteen year history the revolution has come shows how the black panthers embodied black power through the party s international activism interracial alliances commitment to address state violence and desire to foster self determination in oakland s black communities

tells the history of the ford carter years discusses the relevance of the period s politics on today s issues and explains its shaping of the current political environment

like other great figures of 20th century american politics lyndon johnson defies easy understanding an unrivaled master of vote swapping back room deals and election day skulduggery he was nevertheless an outspoken new dealer with a genuine commitment to the poor and the underprivileged with aides and colleagues he could be overbearing crude and vindictive but at

other times shy sophisticated and magnanimous perhaps columnist russell baker said it best johnson was a character out of a russian novel a storm of warring human instincts sinner and saint buffoon and statesman cynic and sentimentalist but johnson was also a representative figure his career speaks volumes about american politics foreign policy and business in the forty years after 1930 as charles de gaulle said when he came to jfk s funeral kennedy was america s mask but this man johnson is the country s real face in lone star rising robert dallek winner of the prestigious bancroft prize for his study of franklin d roosevelt now turns to this fascinating sinner and saint to offer a brilliant definitive portrait of a great american politician based on seven years of research in over 450 manuscript collections and oral histories as well as numerous personal interviews this first book in a two volume biography follows johnson s life from his childhood on the banks of the pedernales to his election as vice president under kennedy we see johnson the twenty three year old aide to a pampered millionaire representative become a de facto congressman and at age twenty eight the country s best state director of the national youth administration we see johnson the human dynamo first in the house and then in the senate whirl his way through sixteen and eighteen hour days talking urging demanding reaching for influence and power in an uncommonly successful congressional career dallek pays full due to johnson s failings his obsession with being top dog his willingness to cut corners and worse to get there but he also illuminates johnson s sheer brilliance as a politician the high regard in which key members of the new deal including fdr held him and his genuine concern for minorities and the downtrodden no president in american history is currently less admired than lyndon johnson bitter memories of vietnam have sent johnson s reputation into free fall and recent biographies have painted him as a scoundrel who did more harm than good lone star rising attempts to strike a balance it does not neglect the tawdry side of johnson s political career including much that is revealed for the first time but it also reminds us that lyndon johnson was a man of exceptional vision who from early in his career worked to bring the south into the mainstream of american economic and political life to give the disadvantaged a decent chance and to end racial segregation for the well being of the nation

in the war for korea 1945 1950 a house burning one of our most distinguished military historians argued that the conflict on the korean peninsula in the middle of the twentieth century was first and foremost a war between koreans that began in 1948 in the second volume of a monumental trilogy allan r millett now shifts his focus to the twelve month period from north korea s invasion of south korea on june 25 1950 through the end of june 1951 the most active phase of the internationalized korean war moving deftly between the battlefield and the halls of power millett weaves together military operations and tactics without losing sight of cold war geopolitics strategy and civil military relations filled with new insights on the conflict his book is the first to give combined arms its due looking at the contributions and challenges of integrating naval and air power with the ground forces of united nations command and showing the importance of korean support services he also provides the most complete and sympathetic account of the role of south korea s armed forces drawing heavily on rok and korea military advisory group sources millett integrates non american perspectives into the narrative especially those of mao zedong chinese military commander peng dehuai josef stalin kim il sung and syngman rhee and he portrays walton walker and matthew ridgway as the heroes of korea both of whom had a more profound understanding of the situation than douglas macarthur whose greatest flaw was not his politics but his strategic and operational incompetence researched in south korean chinese and soviet as well as american and un sources millett has exploited previously ignored or neglected oral history collections including interviews with american and south korean officers and has made extensive use of reports based on interrogations of north korean and chinese pows the end result is masterful work that provides both a gripping narrative and a greater understanding of this key conflict in international and american history

overseeing the vietnam war and contending with these complex policy issues taxed even mcnamara s enormous energy and brilliant intellect as he struggled to manage dod programs his long cherished cost cutting programs fell by the wayside his favored weapons systems were swept aside his committed efforts to limit strategic arms faltered and his reputation was permanently tarnished mcnamara clifford and the burdens of vietnam highlights the interaction of mcnamara and clifford with the white house congress the jcs the department of state and other federal agencies involved in policy formulation the two secretaries increasingly found that the cost of winning the war became a morally prohibitive as the price of losing

prolific munitions production keyed america s triumph in world war ii but so did the complex economic controls needed to sustain that production artillery tanks planes ships trucks and weaponry of every kind were constantly demanded by the

military and readily supplied by american business while that relationship was remarkably successful in helping the u s win the war it also raised troubling issues about wartime economies that have never been fully resolved paul koistinen s fourth installment of a monumental five volume series on the political economy of american warfare focuses on the mobilization of national resources for a truly global war koistinen comprehensively analyzes all relevant aspects of the world war ii economy from 1940 through 1945 describing the nation s struggle to establish effective control over industrial supply and military demand and revealing the growing partnership between the corporate community and the armed services koistinen traces the evolution of federal agencies mobilizing for war including the national defense advisory commission the office of production management and the supply priorities and allocation board and then focuses on the work of the war production board from 1942 1945 as the war progressed the wpb and related agencies oversaw the military s supply and procurement systems stabilized the economy while financing the war closely monitored labor relations and controlled the shipping and rationing of fuel and food in chronicling american mobilization koistinen reveals how representatives of industry and the armed services expanded upon their growing prewar ties to shape policies for harnessing the economy and how federal agencies were subsequently riven with dissension as new deal reformers and anti new deal corporate elements battled for control over mobilization itself as the armed services emerged as the principal customers of a command economy the military industrial nexus consolidated its power and ultimately succeeded in bending the reformers to its will the product of exhaustive archival research arsenal of world war ii shows that mobilization meant more than simply harnessing the economy for war it also involved struggles for power and position among a great many interest groups and ideologies nearly two decades in the making it provides an ambitious and enormously insightful overview of the emergence of the military industrial economy one that still resonates today as america continues to wage wars around the globe

reconsiders secretary of defense robert s mcnamara s decisions during the vietnam war exposing doubts and questions

the explosive rise in the u s incarceration rate in the second half of the twentieth century and the racial transformation of the prison population from mostly white at mid century to sixty five percent black and latino in the present day is a trend that cannot easily be ignored many believe that this shift began with the tough on crime policies advocated by republicans and southern democrats beginning in the late 1960s which sought longer prison sentences more frequent use of the death penalty and the explicit or implicit targeting of politically marginalized people in the first civil right naomi murakawa inverts the

conventional wisdom by arguing that the expansion of the federal carceral state a system that disproportionately imprisons blacks and latinos was in fact rooted in the civil rights liberalism of the 1940s and early 1960s not in the period after murakawa traces the development of the modern american prison system through several presidencies both republican and democrat responding to calls to end the lawlessness and violence against blacks at the state and local levels the truman administration expanded the scope of what was previously a weak federal system later administrations from johnson to clinton expanded the federal presence even more ironically these steps laid the groundwork for the creation of the vast penal archipelago that now exists in the united states what began as a liberal initiative to curb the mob violence and police brutality that had deprived racial minorities of their first civil right physical safety eventually evolved into the federal correctional system that now deprives them in unjustly large numbers of another important right freedom the first civil right is a groundbreaking analysis of root of the conflicts that lie at the intersection of race and the legal system in america

schwab examines america s decision to stand in vietnam with a fresh perspective provided by new archival materials and the intellectual synthesis of institutional political and diplomatic history vietnam policy is shown at many different levels from the presidency down to the level of cia operatives in the field and public opinion specialists on the white house staff the views of state department officers foreign public opinion editorials in major u s newspapers and the powerful leaders of both congressional houses reveal an informed and highly conflicted public leadership well before american combat troops were committed in large numbers in the summer of 1965 the study begins with john f kennedy s inaugural address in january of 1961 and proceeds to show the decision making rocess regarding vietnam and indochina through the several critical events that led to johnson s famous press conference speech of 1965 the author contends that responsibility for the war and its tragic consequences should not be placed upon individuals but rather at the levels of the state society and the international system this view of agency existing at a higher level than the presidency challenges the dominant view of most diplomatic historians and other writers who have focused on the blunders and misperceptions of policy makers

constitutional administrative law while president obama has repeatedly emphasized his administration s commitment to transparency and the rule of law nowhere has this resolve been so quickly and severely tested than with the issue of the possible prosecution of bush administration officials measured or partisan scholarly or journalistic clearly the debate about accountability for the alleged crimes of the bush administration will continue for some time

what path led americans to vietnam why and how did the united states become involved in this conflict drawing on materials from published and unpublished sources in america and great britain historian andrew rotter uncovers and analyzes the surprisingly complex reasons for america s fateful decision to provide economic and military aid to the nations of southeast asia in may 1950

combining rigorous academic scholarship with the experience of a senior pentagon policymaker mara e karlin explores the key national security issue of our time how to effectively build partner militaries given the complex and complicated global security environment declining u s defense budgets and an increasingly connected and often unstable world the united states has an ever deepening interest in strengthening fragile states particularly since world war ii it has often chosen to do so by strengthening partner militaries it will continue to do so karlin predicts given u s sensitivity to casualties a constrained fiscal environment the nature of modern nationalism increasing transnational security threats the proliferation of fragile states and limits on u s public support for military interventions however its record of success is thin while most analyses of these programs focus on training and equipment building militaries in fragile states argues that this approach is misguided instead given the nature of a fragile state karlin homes in on the outsized roles played by two key actors the u s military and unhelpful external actors with a rich comparative case study approach that spans europe asia and the middle east karlin unearths provocative findings that suggest the traditional way of working with foreign militaries needs to be rethought benefiting from the practical eye of an experienced national security official her results based exploration suggests new and meaningful findings for building partner militaries in fragile states

this insightful collection of essays details the political life of one of the most prominent and gifted american statesmen of the twentieth century from his early training in international law to his five terms in the us senate j william fulbright 1905 1995 had a profound influence on us foreign policy and his vision for mutual understanding shaped the extraordinary exchange program bearing his name as a senator for arkansas for thirty years and the longest serving chair of the senate foreign relations committee fulbright was one of the most influential figures of united states politics his criticism of us involvement in vietnam exemplified his belief in the effective management of international norms by international organizations including the united nations which was the subject of his first bill in congress yet alongside his commitments to liberal internationalism and multilateral governance fulbright was a southern politician who embraced the interests of the region s conservative white

population this juxtaposition of biased and broad minded objectives shows a divide at the center of fulbright's vision which still has consequences for america's global policies today this multidimensional volume covers fulbright's development as a national and global voice on foreign relations as he wrestled with the political controversies of the us south during the civil rights movement worked with and challenged executive power and shaped the fulbright program for educational exchange

the author examines fully the military role of chemical warfare and its effects on the people industries and administrations on both sides he also considers the growing moral problems it created the launching of an entirely new weapon that did not discriminate between soldiers and civilians raised complex issues which were debated endlessly between the wars and which in recent years have led to agreement among the powers not to use chemical or biological warfare

the all volunteer force the historic norm in peacetime america was reestablished in the u s on 30 june 1973 when induction authority expired but never before had the u s attempted to field a standing army in peacetime based on voluntary enlistments with the worldwide responsibilities that faced this force since the mid 1980s the ability of the armed forces to recruit and retain quality volunteers has not been seriously questioned this book takes us through those years of transition examining both the context in which the end of the draft occurred and the perspective which the army's leaders brought to bear on the challenge they faced

this book illuminates the decision making processes of the us supreme court through an examination of several prisoners rights cases in 1964 the supreme court declined to hear prisoners claims about religious freedom in 2014 the supreme court heard a case that led to the justices unanimous endorsement of a muslim prisoner's religious right to grow a beard despite objections from prison officials in the fifty year span between those two events the supreme court developed the law concerning rights for imprisoned offenders as demonstrated in this book the factors that shape supreme court decision making are well illustrated by prisoners rights cases this area of law illuminates competing approaches to constitutional interpretation behind the scenes interactions among the justices and the manipulation of legal precedents external actors also affect the supreme court and its decisions when the president appoints new justices and congress targets the judiciary with legislative enactments because of the controversial nature of prisoners rights issues these cases serve to illuminate the full array of influences over supreme court decision making

in a book that william e leuchtenburg writing in the atlantic called a work of considerable power allen matusow documents the rise and fall of 1960s liberalism he offers deft treatments of the major topics anticommunism civil rights great society programs the counterculture making the most throughout of his subject s tremendous narrative potential matusow s preface to the new edition explains the sometimes critical tone of his study the unraveling of america he says was intended as a cautionary tale for liberals in the hope that when their hour struck again they might perhaps be fortified against past error now that they have another chance a look back at the 1960s might serve them well

written by leading historians and political scientists this collection of essays offers a broad and comprehensive coverage of the role of war in american history addressing the role of the armed force and attitudes towards it in shaping and defining the united states the first four chapters reflect the perspectives of historians on this central question from the time of the american revolution to the us wars in vietnam and iraq chapters five and six offer the views of political scientists on the topic one in light of the global systems theory the other from the perspective of domestic opinion and governance the concluding essay is written by historians fred anderson and andrew cayton whose co authored book the dominion of war empire and liberty in north america 1500 2000 provided the common reading for the symposium which produced these essays america war and power will be of much interest to students and scholars of us military history us politics and military history and strategy in general

rising from the ashes explores continuing native american political social and cultural survival and resilience with a focus on the life of numiipuu nez perce anthropologist archie m phinney he lived through tumultuous times as the bureau of indian affairs implemented the indian reorganization act and he built a successful career as an indigenous nationalist promoting strong independent american indian nations rising from the ashes analyzes concepts of indigenous nationalism and notions of american indian citizenship before and after tribes found themselves within the boundaries of the united states collaborators provide significant contributions to studies of numiipuu memory land loss and language numiipuu palus and cayuse survival peoplehood and spirituality during nineteenth century u s expansion and federal incarceration phinney and his dedication to education indigenous rights responsibilities and sovereign native nations american indian citizenship before u s domination and now the jicarilla apaches self actuated corporate model and native nation building among the numiipuu and other pacific northwestern tribal nations anchoring the collection is a twenty first century analysis of american indian decolonization

sovereignty and tribal responsibilities and responses

this is a history of the norwegian intelligence service nis during the cold war based on its secret archives the author describes a service that grew from a handful of specialists in 1946 to a multi faceted organization with a personnel of about 1000 by the end of the 1960s

the u s army s transition to the all volunteer force is a compelling analysis of the process by which the army responded to the requirements of creating an all volunteer force reestablished in the united states at midnight on 30 june 1973 when induction authority expired that the transition from virtual dependency on the draft to a manpower system based on volunteerism was accomplished nearly simultaneously with the withdrawal from vietnam is all the more remarkable robert k griffith jr takes us through the turbulent years of transition from 1968 to 1974 examining both the broad context in which the end of the draft occurred and the less well known perspective that army leaders brought to bear on the challenge they faced in spite of an environment of fierce opposition those charged with developing and implementing the army s three phased program to achieve all volunteer status persevered and approached the task with a determination to succeed griffith s history shows the key role played by the army staff and army secretariat in shaping the army as it underwent deep alterations in the very foundations of its structure it provides both a glimpse into the dynamics of the reciprocal relationship between the army and society and is a useful case study of the successful management of fundamental organizational change

in against immediate evil andrew johnstone tells the story of how internationalist americans worked between 1938 and 1941 to convince the u s government and the american public of the need to stem the rising global tide of fascist aggression as war approached the internationalist movement attempted to arouse the nation in order to defeat noninterventionism at home and fascism overseas johnstone s examination of this movement undermines the common belief that the japanese attack on pearl harbor wrenched an isolationist united states into global armed conflict and the struggle for international power johnstone focuses on three organizations the american committee for non participation in japanese aggression the committee to defend america by aiding the allies and fight for freedom that actively promoted a more global role for the united states based on a conception of the four freedoms later made famous by fdr the desire to be free from fear was seen in concerns regarding america s immediate national security the desire to be free from want was expressed in anxieties over the nation s future

economic prosperity the need for freedom of speech was represented in concerns over the potential loss of political freedoms finally the need for freedom of worship was seen in the emphasis on religious freedoms and broader fears about the future of western civilization these groups and their supporters among the public and within the government characterized the growing global conflict as one between two distinct worlds and in doing so set the tone of american foreign policy for decades to come

the middle power project describes a defining period of canadian and international history during the second world war canada transformed itself from british dominion to self proclaimed middle power it became an active enthusiastic and idealistic participant in the creation of one of the longest lasting global institutions of recent times the united nations this was in many historians opinions the beginning of a golden age in canadian diplomacy chapnick suggests that the golden age may not have been so lustrous during the un negotiations canadian policymakers were more cautious than idealistic the civil service was inexperienced and often internally divided canada s significant contributions were generally limited to the much neglected economic and social fields nevertheless creating the un changed what it meant to be canadian rightly or wrongly from the establishment of the un onwards canadians would see themselves as leading internationalists based on materials not previously available to canadian scholars the middle power project presents a critical reassessment of the traditional and widely accepted account of canada s role and interests in the formation of the united nations it will be read carefully by historians and political scientists and will be appreciated by general readers with an interest in canadian and international history
